## Introduction

## **ABOUT THE SITE**

Envision LA is based in Watts at Powerhouse Church. Planted 11 years ago, Powerhouse is a multiracial church ministering to the community 7 days a week. Some of the ministries include: medical/dental clinics, a crisis pregnancy mobile unit, a food bank, children's ministries, VBS, Summer JAM enrichment, men's and women Bible studies, literacy classes, driver's education classes, prayer and intercession, resume writing, GED tutoring, addiction recovery, grief recovery and PHLI (residential men's discipleship program.) Envision LA is in the process of beginning an after school program. Their prayerful hope is to launch a preschool and elementary school soon.

The home base for ministry is the three story building which houses the medical/dental clinics, church, offices, apartments, sleeping areas, restrooms with showers, PHLI (Power House Leadership Institute), kitchen and food bank. Inside the courtyard is a large playground area, picnic tables and a parking area. The team is currently one year into a three-year "lease to own"agreement. They are praying for God to miraculously provide the funding needed to purchase the ministry building.




### MEET THE TEAM

Site Coordinators Todd and Jennifer Grant are the site coordinators for Envision LA, and Todd is the pastor of Powerhouse Church. They have been married 25 years and have 7 amazing kids. Both Todd and Jen both grew up in Columbus, Ohio but didn't meet until Todd transferred to Asbury University for his senior year...when Jen had just arrived on campus as a freshman. After dating for 3 ½ years, they got married after Jen graduated. Todd continued his education at Asbury Seminary and Jen taught in a local elementary school. They lived in KY during the week and traveled to Ohio on the weekends where Todd was a student pastor. Todd has pastored small rural churches and been on staff at large suburban ones as well. Jen has taught/tutored students from preschool levels to adult literacy classes. Todd returned to Asbury Seminary in 1996 to participate in the Beeson Program and received his D. Min degree in 1999. Feeling the call to church plant, they moved to Tucson to begin a new church. After six years there they responded to God's call to serve him in the city. Todd transferred his ordination to the Christian and Missionary Alliance and they moved to L.A.. Todd was on staff at Lyn-Gate Church while they acclimated to the city and sought God's direction for where to plant. God led them to Watts and in a joint effort between the C&MA and World Impact, they led the church plant team to establish Powerhouse Church. Watts has been their home for 11 years now.

Todd and Jen are humbled and grateful to serve our King in Watts and He has been so faithful. They are passionate about discipleship and reconciliation. Their focus is to reach more and more people for Christ and raise them up to be leaders in the church, their homes and our community. They are funded through our district and by individuals and churches who support us financially.

Our emerging leaders at Powerhouse, as well as Envision interns, will be assisting and leading your team through logistics, devotions, cooking, ministry and worship. We all are looking forward to meeting you, serving with you during your time here, and growing and learning together.



# **General Information**

## **TEAM COSTS**

The cost is \$475 per individual of teams for 7 days. The expenses cover meals and lodging. Primary care health insurance is required for every individual that visits the site. Airfare/travel expenses are excluded.

### **INTERN COSTS**

The cost is \$1200 per intern for each month. The expenses cover meals and lodging. Primary care health insurance is required for every individual that visits the site. Airfare/travel expenses are excluded.

### **HOUSING & FOOD**

Our building is safe and enclosed by a secure fence. If driving, you will park in our lot inside the gated area. Our staff stay on site with you and are available in case of emergency. The staff will explain safety precautions and protocol. Please don't bring valuable or irreplaceable items. Keep valuables (purses, wallets, medicines) in your locked room when not in use. Don't lay your phone down unattended. If you need to charge a device, do so in your room.

Teams sleep on the 3rd floor of our ministry building, It is air conditioned and has bunk beds and mattresses. Please bring bedding and towels. Bedding (sleeping bag/pillow) can be provided by Envision LA for a charge. Please indicate if you will need this when you register.

Three meals and an evening snack are prepared and served onsite by our team. If someone has a diagnosed food allergy please tell Envision LA several weeks before your trip. We will be happy to make accommodations.



## **AIRPORT & ARRIVAL INFORMATION**

#### **Flying**

LAX is the closest airport. It is about a 15 minute drive if traffic isn't bad. Depending on group size and the ministry projects you will be working on, you may need to rent a van(s) at the airport. This will be discussed with each group on an individual basis.

#### **DRIVING**

Our ministry center is right beside the 105 freeway at the Wilmington exit. The address is 2003 E. Imperial Hwy., Los Angeles CA 90059. Our building sits on the corner of Grape St. and Imperial Hwy. The entrance to the parking lot is on Grape St. You will turn into the driveway with the sliding fence gate.

### **COMMUNICATIONS**

We know LA is a fascinating city with some cute kids, and you can't wait to show your family and friends what you're experiencing. But we respectfully request that you be careful about taking photos when out in the neighborhood and working with kids on site. It can distract from ministry and be offensive to community members.

Imagine we brought a van of Los Angelenos to your city, and stood outside your home snapping photos of your family as they went about daily tasks. If we came to your church snapping pictures and taking selfies in front of your stores and schools. Imagine if we brought a group every week all summer and each one did that. We want to build relationships, not walls, so please be respectful. If you build a friendship with someone, ask to take their picture and they agree, that's wonderful. If you complete a work project and want to take a picture, go for it. If you get the opportunity to take a selfie at the beach beside a palm tree, that's a bonus. We just ask you to have empathy and show respect.

We respectfully ask that you do not post photos of our three youngest children to social media or the internet and that you don't use their names for privacy concerns. Thank you.

7-7:30 AM Wake up, prepare for the day 7:30-8 AM Personal devotion time 8-9 AM Breakfast 9-12 PM Group devotions, worship, training and prep for ministry 12-1 PM Lunch 1-4:30 PM Ministry and activities 4:30-5:30 PM Rest and restore 5:30-6:30 PM Dinner 6:30-8:30 PM Teambuilding, evening devotions and worship, daily debrief 8:30-10 PM Snack, fellowship time, down time Bedtime prep, quiet hours begin (to respect our neighbors) 10-11 PM 11 PM Lights out


Upon arrival, your leaders will receive a schedule specific to your group and the ministry activities and projects scheduled for your team. We realize there are amazing sites, sports venues and amusement parks in southern CA. There won't be time to experience those during your trip, so if you'd like to take see those, we recommend adding a day or two to your trip. (You will need to plan accordingly to book lodging and make meal plans for those days.) The good news is that we will, most likely, visit one of the most iconic So Cal places, the beach, for team bonding during your trip.

## **INTERNS**

Summer interns closely follow the team schedule, but may vary based on roles and rotation of responsibilities in the team. This may include meal prep, clean up, facilitating devotions, training, ministry activities, worship, service projects, and teambuilding.

Interns here during the school year will plan their roles with Site Coordinators for responsibilities and ministry activities. Intentional discipleship, community building, cultural experiences, and Sabbath time will be included in the schedule.





# **Ministry**

Ministry at Envision LA flows through the local church. The goal of ministry is to build relationships to share the gospel and to disciple others to raise up leaders in families, the church, and the community. We love to connect intern and team gifts and skills with needs in the local church and community, so if you have an idea that God has placed on your heart, we would love to hear about it. Here are some of the ways you can engage:

**PRAYER AND EVANGELISM:** This entails neighborhood prayer walking, door-to-door prayer, Water Bottle Blessings (when we hand out free waters at the nearby train station and engage in conversations as God leads), and sharing the good news as we minister in practical ways throughout the community.

**COMPASSION MINISTRIES:** This involves sharing food or Blessing Bags with our homeless neighbors, those on Skid Row, praying with them and listening to their stories. It also includes sorting and organizing canned goods in our food pantry and organizing items for our monthly Thrift Sale.

**COMMUNITY OUTREACH:** These events are designed to help us meet and connect with our neighbors. It gives us an opportunity to listen to their stories, build relationships and to share the good news with them as God leads. Some examples are a Barbecue, a Thrift Sale, a festival, a backpack giveaway, sports tournaments, skills classes, or a concert.

**CHILDRENYOUTH MINISTRY**: Summer Splash is our 6-week long children's program...a VBS on steroids! We teach the Bible, help them apply it to their lives, sing songs, play games, create crafts, serve snacks and offer a choice of activities each week. These activities include things like beginning robotics, messy science, theater and poetry workshops, sports clinics, and dance classes. During the school year we offer PHASE (Power House After School Enrichment) where students receive one on one academic tutoring, character training, and enrichment activities in literacy, science, art and music. Mid-week during the school year we also have Gems and Arrows (our mid-week event for elementary students) and Soul'd Out (Junior High and Senior High mid-week event.)

**WORK PROJECTS:** By assisting our community with practical tasks, we share the love of Jesus in tangible ways. This includes painting, yard work, cleaning, planting gardens and home repairs.



# **Cultural Sensitivity**

The greater Los Angeles Area contains 5 counties and is home to 18.55 million people. Famous for Hollywood stars, movie sets, amusement parks and beaches, Los Angeles also has one of the highest homeless rates in our country. L.A.'s chronically homeless population has grown 55% since 2013. According to the Institute for the Study of Homelessness and Poverty at the Weingart Center, an estimated 254,000 men, women and children experience homelessness in Los Angeles County during some part of the year and approximately 82,000 people are homeless on any given night. More than one-third of the nation's chronically homeless live in California.

Our neighborhood of Watts is a 2 square mile radius and is home to 42,000 people which makes it the most densely populated neighborhood in LA county. The median age in Watts is 21 which means we also get the title of youngest neighborhood in the county. There are so many children and youth that need to hear about Jesus and His love for them. 44% of Watts lives below the poverty line. We are located about 15 minutes south of downtown Los Angeles and about 15 minutes east of the Pacific Ocean. We are less than 10 miles from the location of the new Los Angeles Rams stadium and once it is built, thousands of people will drive directly past our building for each home game. Watts has 3 large, government-run housing projects including Imperial Courts, Jordan Downs, and Nickerson Gardens, which is the largest government housing unit west of the Mississippi River. There are also several smaller housing projects tucked inside Watts' borders. Watts is famous for the Watts Towers, as well as the Watts Riots. Our neighbors in Watts are primarily Hispanic and African American.
